

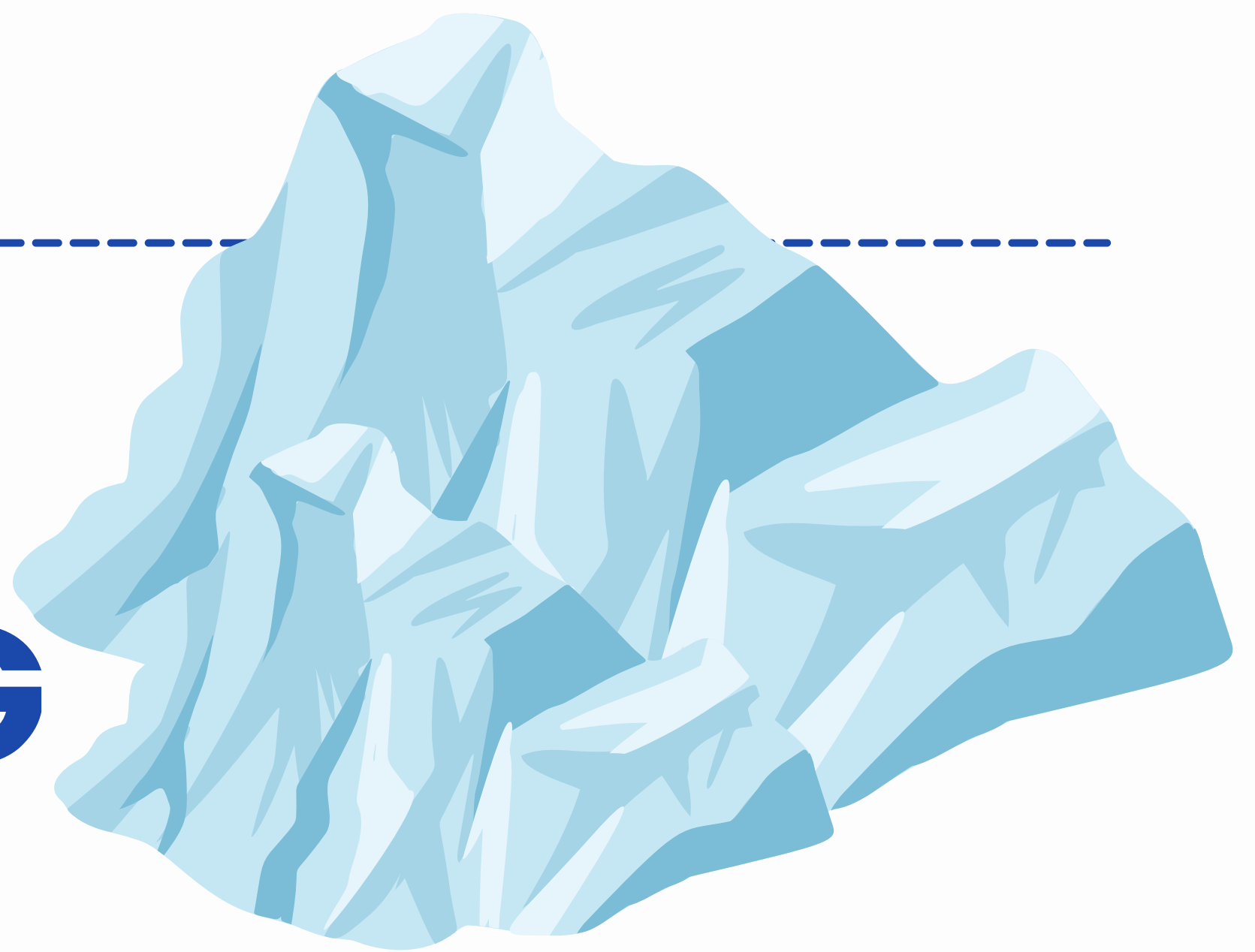

# ICEBERGS WATCHING



## Iceberg FYI.

---

Iceberg season begins early in Newfoundland, and they are here in spring and drift away before summer begins.

---

You don't have to go too far to see icebergs; you can often watch them from the coastline.

---

Icebergs come in many shapes, sizes and colours. The icebergs that arrive on our shoreline are so giant sometimes when they wash up that it makes us wonder how big they were when they first started the journey.

---

Icebergs are here from April, May through June. They sometimes linger around until early July.

---

You can book a boat tour or kayak along the coast and watch the majestic bergs drift on their journey.

---

Safety is essential when you are watching icebergs. It would help if you stayed back a safe distance because icebergs are unstable and can break apart or rollover.

## TWILLINGATE

Twillingate is the icebergs capital of Newfoundland and Labrador

## ST. ANTHONY

This is one of the first places icebergs drift past to start there journey to Newfoundland



## TRINITY BAY

This is one of the best places to view Icebergs on the Bonavista Peninsula. When they arrive in Trinity, they are plentiful.

---

## FOGO ISLAND

Fogo Island is in the path of Icebergs Alley. You will most likely see Icebergs off the coast of Fogo Island when you get there.



# BEST SPOTS TO SEE ICEBERGS



## POUCH COVE

You can watch icebergs from the shoreline or hike along the Eastcoast trail and watch them float along the coast.

## GRATES COVE

The icebergs that show up in Grate Cove are massive and come in many shapes and change color as they melt.



## FERRYLAND

They don't come to Ferryland frequently, but when they do, they are humungous. The share size will have you wonder how big it was when it started the journey to Newfoundland.

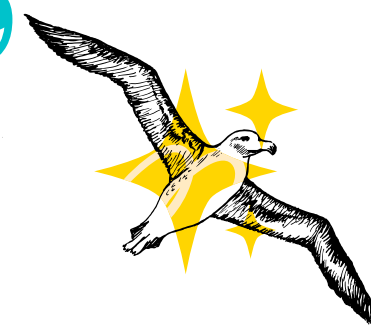
## TORBAY

You can watch icebergs from the shoreline in Torbay. They often drift into the harbour, so you can get a closer look when this happens.





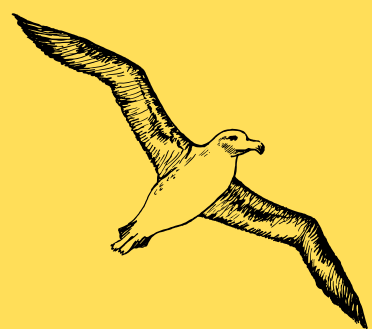

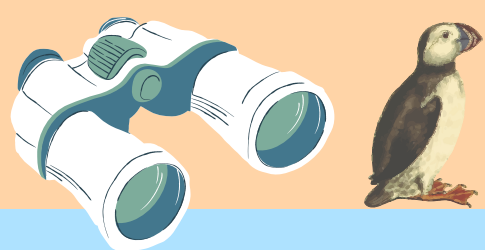
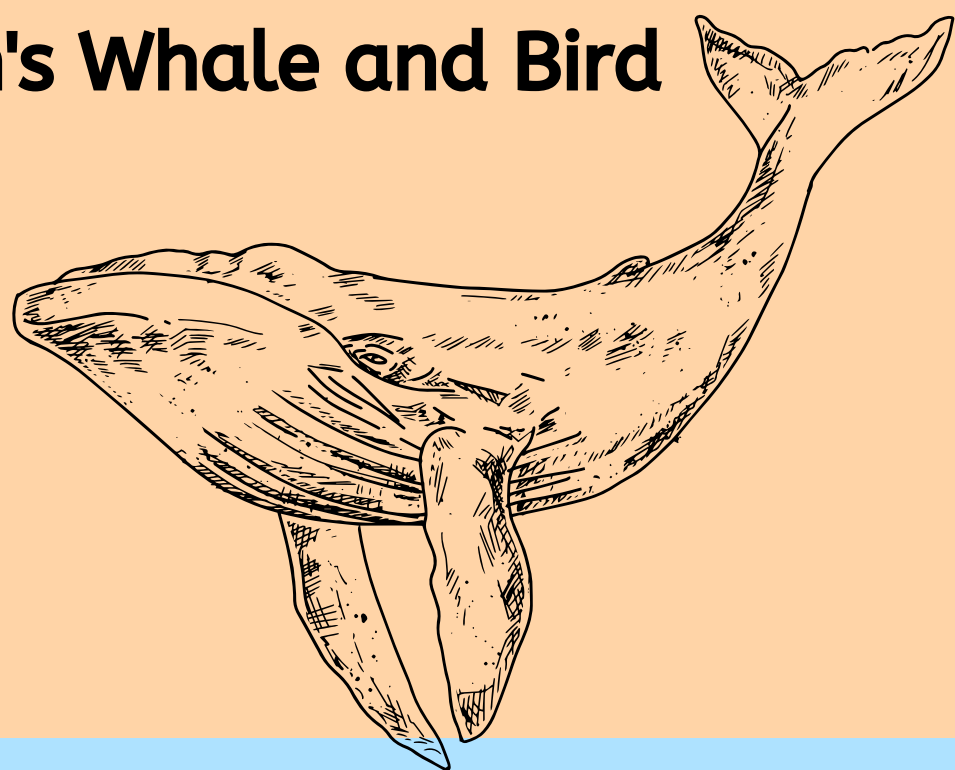




# PLACES TO ENJOY ICEBERGS & WHALE WATCHING IN NEWFOUNDLAND AND LABRADOR

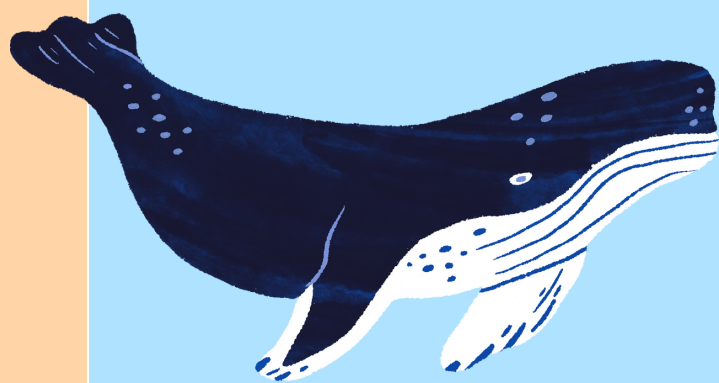
## VISIT BAY BULLS

You can whale watch from the shoreline on this beach. The whales swim very close to shore so that you can get a good view of them.



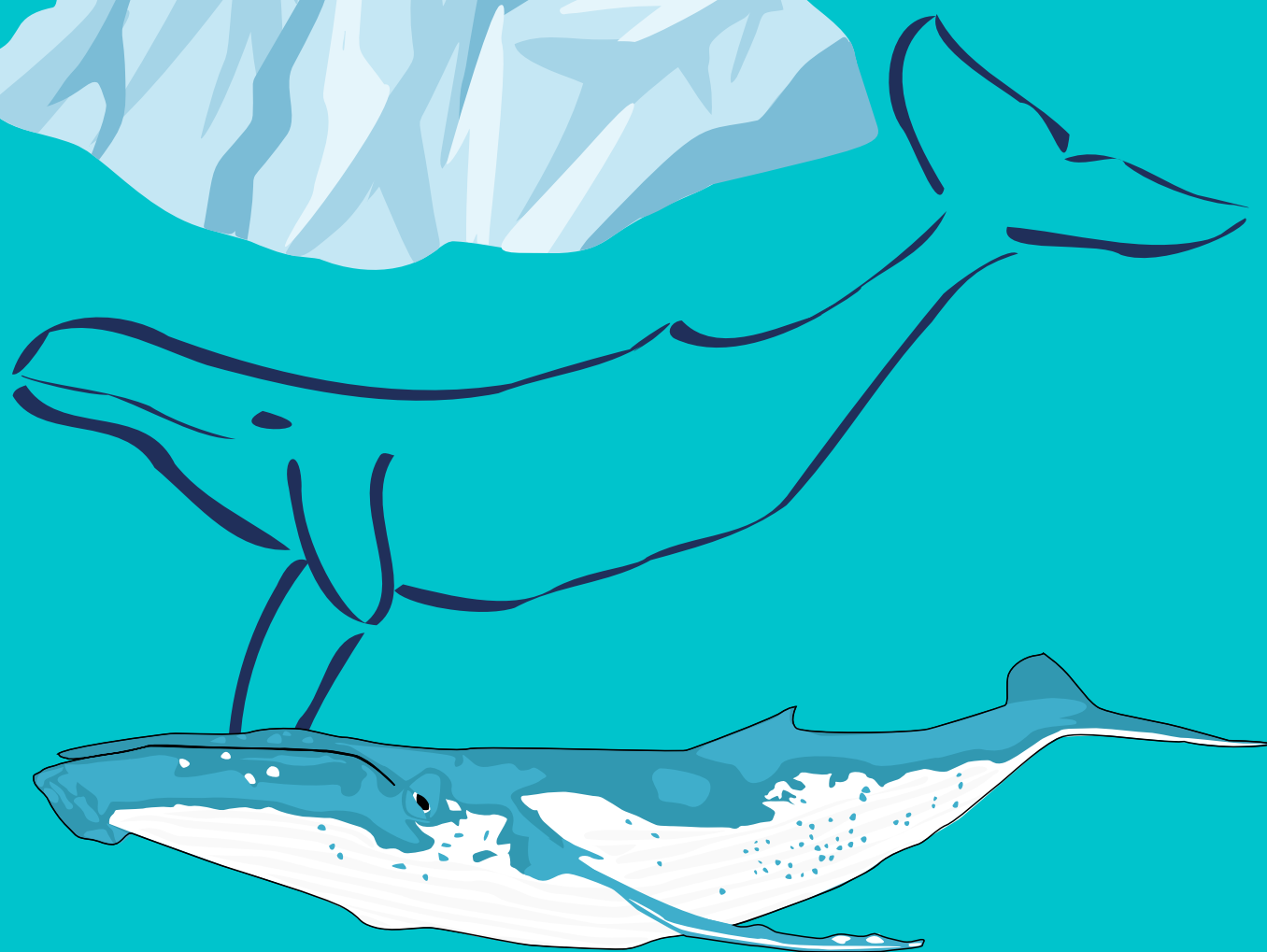
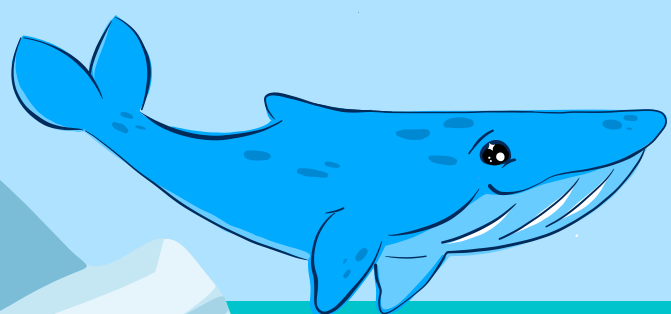
## VISIT TRINITY

## VISIT TWILLINGATE

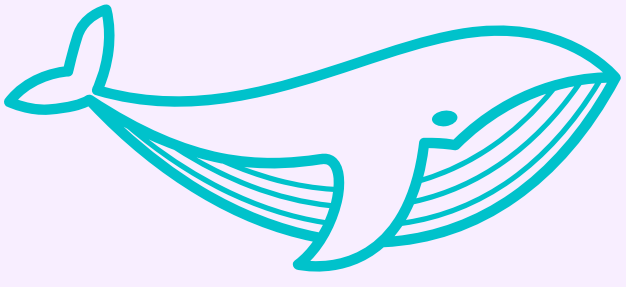

## VISIT ST ANTHONY

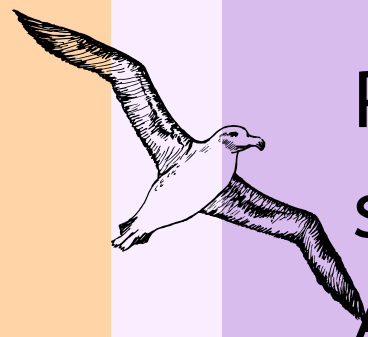

# Whale Species You May See



## Humpback Whale

The humpback whale is a large species of baleen whale. Humpbacks have a stocky body shape and are known for their spectacular breaching.



## Pothead Whale

Pothead whales are one of the largest species of whale that swim in the Atlantic. They have distinctive rounded heads.

## Blue Whale

Blue whales are giant animals on Earth that swim in our ocean, growing to lengths of over 100 feet. They can be found in the Atlantic oceans and have a distinctive coloration of light gray with a white underbelly. Blue whales eat krill and small fish.



## Fin Whale

The fin whale is named for its large dorsal fin, which is visible even when the animal dives underwater.
